Report of Activities

A. FIDE IO Seminars:

After the transformation period on 2012, FIDE Events Commission is in the pleasant situation to announce 14 scheduled International Organizers Seminars for 2013. The seminars are taking place in 4 Continents **and 5 different languages**. More than 10 lecturers are already involved.

B.IO Titles and licensing regulations

The new system of awarding the FIDE IO title is providing more training and ensure more creditability for the International Organizers. The rapidly increasing number of FIDE IOs is creating a new organized & licensed community for FIDE.

C. New tournament regulations - Specific events

The new tournament and specific event regulations approved on Krakow on 2011 started to be valid partly on 2013 and they will have full implementation from 2014. The new regulations improve technically our events, make them more attractive and commercial.

We have important raise of interest and increase of participation in all events manage by FIDE EVE. **The last six months** we had new participation record, in World Olympiad U16 (Turkey and China), World Youth (Slovenia), World Amateur (Romania), World School (Greece). The increased participants in FIDE events create also additional revenues through FIDE fees. We have achieved **better control and monitoring** of our events. The draft regulations are checked in detail, in comparison with original bids and FIDE regulations before approved and circulated to the National Federations. The new position of **FIDE Technical Delegate** improves the co-ordination between FIDE and organizers and the same time can ensure the conditions of participants and FIDE interests and standards.

D. Meetings

There was a co-ordination meeting between **FIDE EVE and WCCO in Athens on 21 & 22 February 2013**. The meeting was very creative and productive. Various amendments and proposals were made aiming in the better understanding and wording of FIDE Events Regulations, the formalization of bid procedures and the co-ordination between EVE and WCCO. The proposals will be forwarded and discussed in the annual meeting of FIDE Events Commission during the 84th FIDE Congress for approval. Commission Chairman **Boris Kutin** took part also in the meeting of the **Fide Central Board of Commissions** in Bangkok. Thailand from 12 to 14 of April.

E. FIDE IO Manual

FIDE IO Manual printed on 2012, become popular between National federations and Organizers. For further popularization we decided to translated it to more languages. So **the Russian edition** is prepared and published. **Spanish version** will follow and next step will be the **Chinese**. After the coming FIDE Congress and decision on additions, amendments and changes in wording, the English version will be updated also and a new 2014 version will be available.

F. New Projects

FIDE EVE is working for the formation and budgeting of the annual FIDE Awards Gala. The same time actions were taking for a sports- business proposal for FIDE Dress Code, creation of protocol, marketing and sponsorship guidelines.

G. Conclusions

After the Commission restruction on the end of 2010 and the new duties, EVE Commission activated in all related fields preparing new modern regulations and standardization of the FIDE Events. Today with the first plan of action plan completed , results are clear. We have established standard procedures for bids, approval of invitations, seminars, titles. FIDE Events become more popular and prestigious and the same time more commercial.

Annual Meeting

Report

The city of Thessaloniki during the 4st stage of FIDE Grand-Prix hosted the 2013 "Events Commission Annual Meeting" . The meeting was chaired **by Chairman of Commission Mr. Boris Kutin**. The Meeting was also attended by the Secretary of the Commission Mr.Theodoros Tsorbatzoglou (GRE) and the councilor Mr. Ozgur Solakoglou (TUR). Ms. Olena Boytsun (UKR) canceled her trip the last moment informing about a very serious problem. Present partly was also the FIDE Deputy President Mr. Georgios Makropoulos.

The Commission discussed all the subjects included in the Commission's Agenda.

A. Additions & Updating of the FIDE Organizers Manual

The Commission examined in detail all the parts of the current IO Manual. Additions were approved. **A.** Guidelines for disabled players. **B.** Guidelines for the number and titles of Arbiters for FIDE Events. **C.** Summary of Rating Regulations. **D.** Summary of Titles Regulations. IO Manual will be updated with decisions made in FIDE Commissions Meeting in Athens. Mr. David Jarrett will contribute also in re-wording and re-phrasing of the text.

Mr. Theodoros Tsorbatzoglou, Mr. Ozgur Solakoglou will have the task of updating the manual including and any decision will be made on regulations in the coming FIDE Congress in Tallinn. By the end of the year should be ready to the new 2014 edition of the Manual.

B. Administration of FIDE EVE web site

The Commission decided to authorize Mr. Goran Urosevic (SRB) to administrate FIDE EVE site.

Mr. Urosevic will restore and update the web site till the end of 2013

C. FIDE IO Seminars

Mr. Tsorbatzoglou informed that **15 IO Seminars** have scheduled till now for 2013. IO Seminars are organized in each Continent, in 5 languages and 10 different lecturers are involved. The seminars have already completed showed a remarkable participation from 12 to 30 participants. The Commission is very satisfied with the fast popularization of the IO Seminars.

D. Dress Code

Commission has a draft proposal for FIDE dress code. A presentation will be made during the FIDE Congress in Tallinn. If there is a concrete result and a reasonable business proposal will be forwarded to the FIDE Presidential Board.

E. FIDE Competitions

1. Commission Chairman Boris Kutin asked for a letter to World Youth Organizers in Al Ain with the purpose to remind the deadline for the publishment of the official invitation (5 months before the start the latest) and clarifications about accommodation conditions. Furthermore the Commission is ready anytime to visit the venue for inspection and technical support to the Organizing Committee.

2. Commission Chairman Boris Kutin presented a proposal from the city of Dresden for a new World Competition "World Seniors Teams Championship" starting on 2014. The Commission discussed the proposal and decided to forward it to the FIDE Congress with the recommendation for a test event on 2014 or 2015. The dates of the test event can not affect the existing FIDE Calendar and current official Competitions. Further discussions are necessary.

3. FIDE World Cities Championship is scheduled for 2015 in Al Ain. After last year first experience and last moment changes the regulations should be redrafted and republished. Consultation with UAE organizers is necessary.

4. Commission Secretary Theodoros Tsorbatzoglou had a meeting with Georgian Deputy Minister of Sports Zurab Azmaiparashvili where discussed the organization for World Youth U16 Chess Olympiad in Georgia on 2015. The event will organized the same time and same venue with the European Youth Olympic Games. In order to strengthen the FIDE Competition it is proposed the winner of 2015 Youth Olympiad to be eligible for the Baku Chess Olympiad 2016, after acceptance of the organizers. The proposal will come to the FIDE Congress for approval.

F. FIDE Marketing Protocol & Awards Guidelines

1. Commission Secretary Theodoros Tsorbatzoglou was asked to bring a proposal for FIDE (Ceremonies) Protocol after consultation with FIDE General Secretary Ignatius Leong who has prepared a draft.

2. Commission Chairman Boris Kutin has worked in the standardization of FIDE medal winners and participants' certificates. The standard medals and certificates will be described in General regulations and Organizers will be obliged to order them from FIDE main provider or produce them in the same quality and design. The instructions will be included in the FIDE IO Manual.

3. Mr. Theodoros Tsorbatzoglou and Mr. Ozgur Solakoglu have authorized to contact related companies and bring proposal for the Marketing Guidelines.

G. FIDE Technical Delegate

Commission Chairman Boris Kutin is proposing the following addition to FIDE Technical Delegate Guidelines (FIDE Handbook B.10): " **FIDE Technical Delegate has the right and the power to use part or the whole amount of competition deposit fee in order to improve participants' conditions after consultation and refusal by the Organizer**" . If necessary changes should be made also and in the financial regulations.

The coming events were discussed and Commission Chairman will propose the FIDE Technical Delegates on time.

H. FIDE Awards Gala

Commission Chairman Boris Kutin informed that he is preparing a special ceremony for the 90th anniversary of FIDE during the Chess Olympiad in Tromsø, Norway. The FIDE Awards Gala will start on 2015 since needs good preparation, host city and secured budget.

I. Match Africa - Europe

Commission Chairman Boris Kutin informed about contacts with Madagascar to host this event. A FIDE supported seminar should be organized also in Africa Continent. Mr. Solakoglu will co-ordinate and travel as lecturer.

J. Commission

Commission Chairman Boris Kutin will propose a new councilor for the FIDE Events Commission in the next FIDE PB. Mr. Kutin will inform FIDE Secretariat about Commission budget for the next meeting in Tallinn.

Guidelines on treatment of disabled chess players

1. These guidelines will be used for all FIDE rated events.
2. No one has the right to refuse to meet a disabled player against whom he has been correctly paired.
3. All chess venues must either be accessible to all, or an acceptable alternative venue with full supervision shall be available to those who cannot access the nominated venue.
4. A circular shall be sent out when all competitors are known. This circular contains an entry form with the usual points and questions, asking whether any potential competitor has an impairment that will require special circumstances. The competitor has to inform the organisers about the special circumstances at least 20 days before the start of the event.
5. No disabled player shall be “penalised” in accordance with the Articles 6.7d. and 8.1e of the Laws of Chess because of disability.
6. Any impaired competitor who reasonably requests in time the placing of their equipment in a particular seat or orientation, has the right to do so, provided that this does not disadvantage his opponent or other competitors. The event organizer has to ensure that the needs of both players are catered for.
7. All relevant information shall be displayed before the start of the event, including maps of the venue showing the location of toilets, refreshments and emergency exits.
8. In all events there shall be a tournament physician. The organizer and the chief arbiter shall know the phone number of the local hospital and physician.
9. If a competitor cannot access the refreshments, arrangements should be made for their needs to be met.
10. If a competitor cannot press his own clock or move his own pieces, an assistant shall be available unless the opponent is willing to do so. If the opponent is acting as an assistant the chief arbiter may decide to give him extra thinking time.

11. If a player has made a prior request, copies of all notices should be available in large print. If a player is unable to read large print, then the notices must be read to him.
12. It is recommended that all team events have the rule that if a visiting team indicates that it has a player with an impairment coming with them, giving sufficient notice, that the home team does everything which is reasonable to ensure that that player can participate.
13. It is recommended that each national chess federation appoints an officer for matters regarding disabilities.
14. It is strongly recommended that all organisers of chess events adopt these guidelines.

Important issues to take into consideration:

Organisation of the tournament hall:

1. Only one game per table: in case an assistant is needed the tables should be larger (2 m width in order to place the assistants for the disabled) and should be placed separately.
2. The corridors between rows of tables should be twice as large (wheel chairs)
3. The arbiters should be clearly accessible to all players.
4. Foresee additional contact points for electricity: some visually handicapped players use a lamp for their chess board. This lamp should not disturb the opponent.
5. Put the blind chess players at the same place as much as possible (they will know the way to the rest room and back in very short time!) and give them the same assistant during the whole tournament.

Assistants:

1. The assistants should have a minimum knowledge of chess; the language is less important since most of the handicapped players only speak their mother tongue.
2. Assistants for blind players should know the name of the pieces in their language
3. Assistants for blind players should inform the player when they are leaving the chess board temporarily.
4. The assistant should always write the moves: this is an important help for the arbiter.

Tournament organisation:

1. Organise a players meeting for all players before the first round, preferably in the tournament hall.
2. If possible only one round per day should be played.

Chief arbiter:

1. After making the pairings the chief arbiter should decide manually on which board everyone should play: some players (visually handicapped) should always play at the same board whereas the largest space should be foreseen for wheelchair players.
2. Draw proposals or claims can easily go via the assistant.
All players push the clock themselves, except the players who are physically unable to do so.
3. In the case there is a time trouble situation with visually handicapped players the arbiter should bear in mind that the (not visually handicapped) opponent can reply almost immediately. The tournament regulations should therefore release the visually handicapped player from the obligation to record the moves during the last five minutes, even when the game is played with an increment of at least 30 seconds. The visually handicapped player should then update his scoresheet after the time trouble.

10. Guidelines for FIDE Technical Director

Approved by 2012 Congress

1. FIDE Technical Director (FTD) is the overall observer of a FIDE World Event
2. The FIDE Technical Director FTD is appointed by FIDE and must be a licensed International Organizer
3. Main duties of the FIDE Technical Director"
 - a. To be responsible for the communication with the Organizer after the approval and circulation of the tournament regulations.
 - b. To check before the start of the competition if the organization adheres to FIDE standards.
 - c. To check if the Organizer provides to the participants the conditions offered in the bid and described in the event invitation.
 - d. To be contacted by the National Federations as the FIDE Representative.
 - e. To ensure the contact of the competitions according to FIDE rules and regulations
 - f. By the end of the competition to send his report to FIDE including and comparing the final evaluation with the bid-evaluation.

GUIDELINES TO PROTOCOL FOR FIDE EVENTS

(Drafted by General Secretary and FIDE EVE Commission)

1. FIDE OFFICIALS

- 1.1 The following order of seniority shall be observed at all FIDE events, FIDE meetings and activities which FIDE is involved. This includes the seating protocol. (in order of number of years of service within FIDE Presidential Board, then Executive Board, the Zonal Presidents, then Commission Chairmen, then Commission Secretary etc.) In case of persons holding the same positions, seniority shall be decided based on the number of years of service in FIDE in the order of Presidential Board, Executive Board, Zonal President, Commission Membership. When in doubt, the General Secretary shall decide.

- 1.4 Deputy President
- 1.5 General Secretary
- 1.6 Treasurer
- 1.7 Ticket Vice Presidents
- 1.8 Elected Vice Presidents

2. FIDE PRINCIPALS & TECHNICAL OFFICIALS

- 2.1 FIDE Principals & Technical Officials are those appointed by FIDE for the respective roles in a FIDE event. When in doubt, the order of seniority shall be decided by the Technical Delegate.

3. ROLES OF FIDE PRINCIPALS & TECHNICAL OFFICIALS

- 3.1 The President or his Representative shall be the main official representative of FIDE. He shall be accorded the highest level of hospitality. He shall be given entitled to deliver the official FIDE speeches at ceremonies, receptions, meetings and any activity.
- 3.2 The Technical Delegate – general organisation - Guidelines FIDE Handbook B.10
- 3.3 The Appeals Committee
- 3.4 The Chief Arbiter
- 3.5 The Press Officer
- 3.6 Other Technical Officials

4. INVITATIONS

- 4.1 Invitations for various ceremonies, receptions, meetings and any activity during a FIDE event shall be accorded as per Rule 1.1 and Rule 2.1 and in consultation with the General Secretary or the Technical Delegate whoever is appropriate at the time.

5. CEREMONIES, MEETINGS & RECEPTIONS

- 5.1 Invitations & Seating Protocol
 - for various ceremonies, receptions, meetings and any activity during a FIDE event shall be in accordance to Rule 1.1 and Rule 2.1 and in consultation with the General Secretary or the Technical Delegate whoever is appropriate at the time.
- 5.2 Programme for the Opening & Closing Ceremonies
 - 5.2.1 The Programme shall be approved by the General Secretary or Technical Delegate whoever is appropriate at the time.
 - 5.2.2 The Programme shall last no longer than 90 minutes for the Opening Ceremony and not more than 120 minutes for the Closing Ceremony.
 - 5.2.3 FIDE shall have the right to deliver a speech.
 - 5.2.4 There should not be more than 3 other Speakers.
 - 5.2.5 Ideally, there should not be more than 7 items of performances. Each performer should not perform more than 3 items.
 - 5.2.6 Prize winners should receive their prizes on a stage. They should stand on the platforms which identify their rankings.
 - 5.2.7 Whereby possible, the anthem of the champions shall be played and their national flag raised.
 - 5.2.8 Photographers should be restrained from standing in front of the VIP rows when taking pictures.

6. FIDE FLAG & LOGO

- 6.1 The FIDE Flag and FIDE Logo must be visibly displayed in the main Backdrop/Banner. For meetings, at least one FIDE Flag must be displayed on the main table.
- 6.2 Where there is an office of the President or his Representative, at least one FIDE Flag must be displayed on his table.
- 6.3 The FIDE Logo shall be included in all publications, Accreditation Cards and Players Table Cards.


7. FIDE ANTHEM
