#### **Evaluation test.**

- ❖ The participants who will achieve 80% and above of the total number of points, will be considered as achieved one norm for the title of FIDE Arbiter.
- ❖ The Organizing Committee of the Seminar will prepare the examination tests, assess the written documents and send a full report to the FIDE Arbiters Commission after the end of the seminar.
- ❖ After the end of the Seminar, all the participants will receive certificates of attendance provided by the Organizers.
