$1 - \underline{Welcome}$

The Chairman Mr Allan Herbert welcomed everyone. He announced that as it was the last meeting in this period of office and is the custom today's meeting would be a review of what has been done. It would be a paperless meeting with everything available online / through email. Everyone was thanked for attending. It had been an honour to serve FIDE Development for the last eight years.

2 - Development Goals

The Chairman revisited the Development Goals and indicated that over the progress to their achievement was encouraging there was still worked to be done. The goals have been incorporated into the Commission's regulations and can be found in FIDE Hand Book under section 2.7.5

2.7.5 The DEV shall aim at achieving the following objectives for developing Federations:

- organisation of National Youth and Junior Championships every year
- organisation of a FIDE-rated National Championship every year
- participation in Chess Olympiads
- each such Federation to have at least five active rated players, five certified and active trainers and five certified and active arbiters

3 - 2017-2018 Development List

Federations are divided into five categories; level one being the most developed and level 5 the least developed. The rational used is the average rating of the top 10 active rated players and the list is updated every two years after the bi annual chess Olympiad. The Chairman pointed out that the number of Federations that do not have any rated players is almost zero.

Attached is full list with projections for the new categories based on the September 2019 Rating list.

4 - Trainers for the 2018 Olympiad

The list of Trainers and Federations they are attached to is attached. The Commission covers the trainers fee and air ticket and assigned Federation names the trainer as their team captain so they come under their free accommodation allocation. All allocations are done on a 'first come first served' basis with requests to be received by the end of February in the year of the Olympiad. Questions were asked as to how the country is chosen. Nigel Short suggested that maybe the Commission should consider supporting an equal number of Open and Ladies teams. The budget for the Trainers was 60,000 euros.

5 - DGT Development Pricing


The Chairman thanked DGT and their CEO Hans Pees for the excellent co-operation with the commission. Last year a special offer was made to every Federation by DGT and over 20 countries including Federations in levels 1 & 2 took advantage to purchase chess clocks for their respective Unions. England, Scotland and Wales for example bought a lot of clocks as many areas in the UK still did not have digital clocks. The special price was 15 euros for a DGT 2010.

An application form is available for developing Federations to be able to order equipment through the Commission at the special prices during the Olympiad.

6 - Programmes and Financial Incentives

Activity Rebates

The activity rebates incentive continued to benefit many Federations.



2018 Budget

The 2018 Budget details are all set out in the attached presentation.

Mr Short questioned the current policy of allocation of the budget to Continents and the opportunity it presented for political abuse by Continental Presidents.

Clarification was sought from Mr Jones about the additional extra 200,000 euros that was added to the Development budget at the last Presidential Board meeting.

At this point the FIDE Treasurer Mr Siegel entered the room and along with the Commission Chairman explained that this amount was added as a bonus because of FIDE's improved financial position and would not be accessible to the Commission till after the FIDE Elections.

This then led to an extensive discussion about allocation of funds to Continental Presidents especially with reference to Africa. A lively discussion then started between Mr Siegel and the Continental president Mr Ncube with various members contributing from the floor (the Secretary of the Commission wishes to add that it was very difficult to hear all this discussion because of the acoustics of the room). A lot of this discussion revolved around the 30,000 euros given to Africa for the establishment of a new office in South Africa back in 2014.

Mr Short reiterated his concern that there was an inherit bias in the awarding of funds to Continental Presidents and that this could be seen to be dependent on how Federations vote in elections. He then referred to the Trainers budget of €60,000 which is selected by the Continental President as to the distribution. His suggestion was to distribute money directly to Federations dependent upon meeting certain criteria and if the funds were misused in the given time period then they do not get any again etc.

Graham Boxall of Guernsey, and Chairman of Verification, asked the Commission if in their opinion the Commission had the resources to monitor the use of Development funds in the Continents. Mr Hal Bond in his closing remarks and in response to Mr Boxall said that the answer is maybe not.

Accessing Development Funding

The meeting was reminded of the process for accessing Development Funding. A copy of the form

for applying for funding from the Commission is attached.

7. AOB

The Chairman then invited the core Commission members to give their final statements. This can be summarised by saying that everyone thought it was a great honour to serve on the Commission and that it had been a pleasure to work with everyone in the world of chess. And, the General Secretary appealed to the meeting to remember the positives such as 46 African countries out of 54 participating in Batumi.

The Chairman then finished the meeting by reminding the Federations that 'Pocket money' will soon be ready for collection. However, Pocket Money was not a Development Committee initiative but decided by the Olympiad hosting Federation and that the UN Human Development index was used as a guide for deciding which countries got pocket money.



DEVELOPMENT GOALS

- When we say that one of the objectives of DEV is to ensure that one day FIDE has no member Federations that are Developing Federations, how do we define the finish line, that point at which a Federation can claim that it is a Developed Federation?
- It is easy to see that a Federation which has no FIDE rated or Titled players, no FIDE certified Arbiters, has never had any of its National Championships FIDE rated, no indigenous certified FIDE Instructors or Trainers, no Chess-in-Schools programme, no developmental programme for its best juniors, has not participated in an Olympiad or its Continental events in the last 10 years, that such a Federation is the extreme example of a Developing Federation.
- Similarly, we would all agree that if in 10 years none of the above was true for the same Federation, that that Federation would have graduated from being a Developing Federation to a Developed Federation.



DEVELOPMENT GOALS

- DEV's challenge therefore is to agree on common objective measures which clearly distinguish Developing from Developed, what this presentation will term as developmental goals.
- To do this, consider how such a Federation will look in the future compared to its reality today.
- Buts let's not stop there, consider the real value to FIDE of a functioning Federation which rather than being a drain on FIDE is a contributor to FIDE and its Continents. And this, through FIDE's Accounts, can be measured as objectively as we currently measure our players each day with our ratings system.
- So DEV must be seen as an investment in FIDE's future to grow the market for Chess organizers, trainers and equipment producers and ultimately FIDE. And like any investment we must have an expectation on the return of that investment.



DEVELOPMENT GOALS

Written into to the Commission's regulations are the Development Goals which state

2.7.5 The DEV shall aim at achieving the following objectives for developing Federations:

- organization of National Youth and Junior Championships every year
- organization of a FIDE-rated National Championship every year
- participation in Chess Olympiads
- each such Federation to have at least five active rated players, five certified and active trainers and five certified and active arbiters


The DEV shall propose, draw up and maintain a list of Federations requiring technical, financial and chess skills assistance.

The list of countries will be divided into five levels based on the Top Countries Ranking List published after each Olympiad:

- Level I an elo average of 2500 and above
- Level 2 an elo average of below 2500
- Level 3 an elo average of below 2300
- Level 4 an elo average of below 2100
- Level 5 an elo average of below 1800 and unrated

TRAINERS FOR 2018 OLYMPIAD TEAMS

Based on a mutual agreement of DEV and TRG, the basic Regulations for the 2018 Olympiad captains/coaches DEV program are:

- 1. Each Continental President is entitled to register up to five federations/teams. From these five teams, three will be Open Section Teams and two will be Women Section Teams. The registration must be sent to TRG, by February 28th, 2018.
- 2. TRG will pre-select twenty respected and experienced captain/coaches and match them with the twenty teams, after consultation and on the basis of first come-first served.
- 3. Each captain/coach will receive 1.200 euros for his services, 400 euros for ticket and he will also be entitled to free full accommodation, on the position of the team's captain.
- 4. All captains/coaches must be holders of a FIDE-TRG title and be fully licensed on 2018.

DGT DEVELOPMENT PRICING

1. The Development price for chess clocks is 15 euro for the DGT2010 and to 20 euro for the DGT3000. The clocks shall receive a print on the back indicating they are supplied for FIDE Chess Development.

2. Affordable electronic boards are available from November 2017 that will further enable the global chess community to arrange live tournament broadcasting. The new Smart Boards can be used together with existing wooden DGT boards and the free LiveChess software. For FIDE Development purposes, a complete tournament set including the board, electronic chess pieces, cables and DGT3000 chess clock, will be made available for around 145 euro per set.

3. DGT has agreed to make clocks and boards available for Development prices to all FIDE Federations so that FIDE can approve Development orders as it sees fit, for example to support active Federations or special projects.

4. Non-electronic boards and sets as well as basic chess clocks are added to the Development pricelist to benefit Chess in Schools and other projects.


• The entry fees must be paid to FIDE at the time the participant (participating team) is entered for the competition. Twenty per cent (20%) of the entry fees for FIDE events (except Olympiad) will go to the credit of the organizing federation (50% in case of chess developing federations).

Section 7.2 Invoices to Federations

- Chess developing countries in level 5 will have FIDE fees (except Membership Fee) offset of up to the amount of €1,000.
- Chess developing countries in level 4 will have FIDE fees (except Membership Fee) offset of up to the amount of €750.
- Chess developing countries in level 3 will have FIDE fees (except Membership Fee) offset of up to the amount of €500.

To understand the process for accessing Development Funding it is important to understand that DEV's Budget is:

- Developed in collaboration with FIDE Treasurer, Continental Presidents and DEV Chairman
- Approved as part of FIDE Budget in the General Assembly
- Comprised of five main components:
 - Allocations direct to Continents (approximately 50% of total budget)
 - FIDE Activity Rebates (approximately 17 % of total budget)
 - Special Projects (approximately 30 % of total budget)
 - DEV Chairman's Discretionary Budget (approximately 3% of total budget)

ACCESSING DEVELOPMENT FUNDING ACTIVITY REBATE

- If approved by the Continental President the Application is submitted to the Chairman of the Development Commission for sign-off before being sent to FIDE Treasurer for allocation of funds based on FIDE's Cash Flow.

- The form has a follow up requirement where it asks for an evaluation of the funding one year later.
