REPORT OF THE AFRICAN CONTINENTAL PRESIDENT TO THE 2018 FIDE GENERAL ASSEMBLY (BATUMI, GEORGIA - September 27 to October 5, 2018)

1. INTRODUCTION

From the beginning of 2018 to date the apparent stand-off between the FIDE Treasurer and the African Chess Confederation (ACC) in respect of financial support for various activities.

This report to the 2018 FIDE General Assembly covers a review of the tournaments hosted in 2018 to date with major incidents of the arising disputes that have become a source of major concern.

2. TOURNAMENTS

i. 2018 ZONE 4.3 INDIVIDUAL CHESS CHAMPIONSHIPS

The 2018 Zone 4.3 Individual Chess Championships were hosted by the Mozambican Chess Federation in the Mozambican capital of Maputo from April 7, 2018(arrival) to April 15, 2018 (departure).

A total of 45 players took part in the event with 24 in the Open Section and 21 in the Women's Section.

The Open Section was won by FM Catarino Domingos of Angola with a score of 6.5/9 to clinch the Gold Medal.

The Silver Medal was won by FM Phemelo Khetho of Botswana with a superior tie-break score over the Bronze Medalist FM Calvin John Klaasen of South Africa with both players scoring 6/9 with another two players.

The Women's Section was won by Megan van Niekerk with a score of 7.5/9 to take the Gold Medal.

WIM Jesse Nikki February of South Africa won the Silver Medal with a score of 6.5/9, whilst WIM Onkemetse Francis of Botswana won the Bronze Medal with a score of 6/9.

ii. 2018 AFRICAN INDIVIDUAL CHESS CHAMPIONSHIPS

The 2018 Africa Individual Chess Championships were held in the Zambian tourist capital Livingstone from May 12, 2018 (arrival) to May 22, 2018 (departure).

The event consisted of Classic, Rapid and Blitz time controls in both sections of the event.

The final placings after nine rounds were as follows:

The 2018 African Youth Chess Championships were hosted in Kisumu, Kenya from August 12 to 18, 2018.

The General Assembly of the African Chess Confederation (ACC) rec-convened on 03 October 2018 at the Hilton Hotel for the purposes of elections.

1. Electoral Committee

The Electoral Committee endorsed by the General Assembly consisted of the following persons:

- 2. Elections
 - 2.1. There were only two candidates who contested after Tshepo Sitale withdrew in favour of Dr Essoh's ticket. The two ACC Presidential Candidates were:
 - 2.1.1. Dr Essoh Essis; and
 - 2.1.2. Lewis Ncube
 - 2.2. The Results
 - 2.2.1. The total number of delegates (e.g. total votes available) as per the roll call at the time of voting was 45.
 - 2.2.2. Lewis Ncube's ticket won by 23 votes to 21 votes of Dr Essoh Essis's. There was 1 spoiled ballot paper.
 - 2.3. ACC Board
