


What does redemption mean anyway?

Fine words, but where is the evidence?

- In my case, from English prisons, hundreds of letters from prisoners over several years
- Real testimony about the power of chess
- The influence it has on use of time, relationship with others (communication and behaviour) and being self-critical
- OVERALL BENEFIT = THINK BEFORE YOU MOVE

Some real-life testimony









- I go to chess club now at 7pm, instead of burgling houses
- Helped me to think and even speak better
- Made new friends that I never would have before
- Made contact with my father after many years through chess
- It gave me the focus to set up my own business
- I learned to think before I moved. I did not accept drugs
- Helps my autism and Asperger's Syndrome.
- I got better at other things like mathematics and English
- Chess makes me realise actions have consequences
