Dead position

5.2.2 The game is drawn when a **position has arisen in which neither player can checkmate the opponent's king with any series of legal moves**. The game is said to end in a **'dead position'**. This immediately ends the game, provided that the move producing the position was in accordance with Article 3 and Articles 4.2 – 4.7.

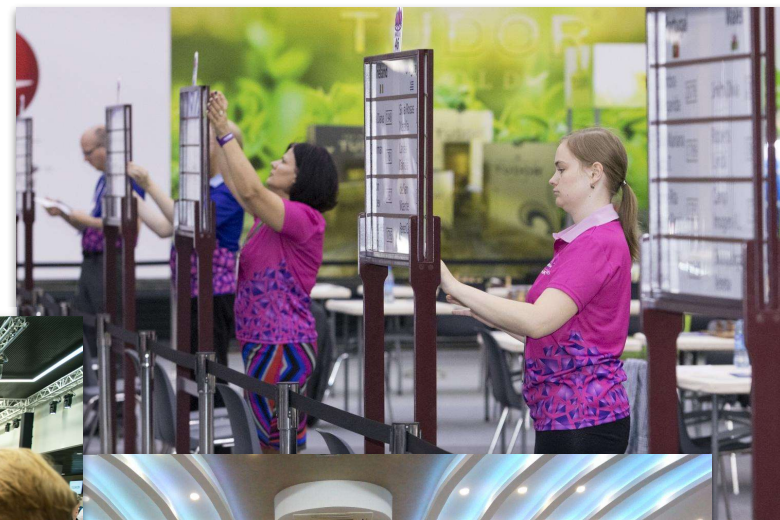

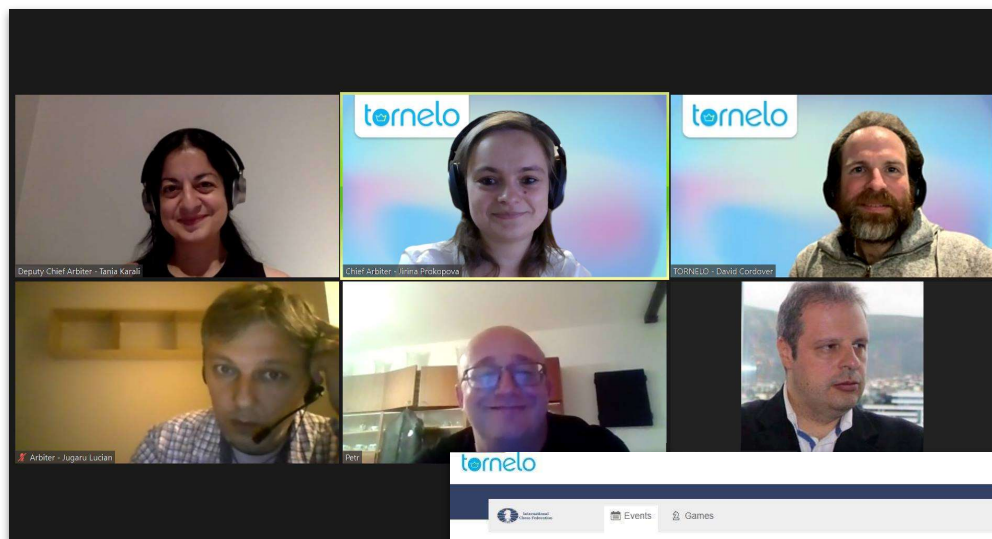
