Playing Hall - City Museum and Historical Archives

The municipal museum is housed in an 1881 building, which was the residence and office of the first colonial Port Master of Larnaca. On the ground floor is the City museum with exhibits emphasizing the long, glorious and uninterrupted history of the town. A large collection of the city's coins minted in the local mint starting with the first coin of the city Kingdom of Kition of the late 6th century and a fabulous collection of city photographs through the years dating from 1850, are among the most interesting exhibits. On the second floor are located the city's archives, which are open only for researchers as they include rare books, editions and documents.



General Information

Cyprus Currency

The currency of the Republic of Cyprus is the <u>Euro (\in)</u>. It is divided into 100 Euro cents ($^{\updownarrow}$).





The Cypriot pound was replaced by the euro as official currency of the Republic of Cyprus on 1 January 2008 at the irrevocable fixed exchange rate of 0.585274 CYP per 1 euro. However, pound banknotes and coins continued to have legal tender status and were accepted for cash payments until 31 January 2008.

Cypriot pounds were convertible free of charge at Cypriot credit institutions until 30 June 2008.

CYP coins were convertible at the Central Bank of Cyprus until 31 December 2009 and CYP banknotes will be convertible until 31 December 2017.

Banks - Credit and Debit Cards

There are too many main branch banks in Larnaca. You can use Mastercard, Visa and Cirrus cards throughout Cyprus and also withdraw money from cash points with your cards, although charges will apply.

The Climate of Cyprus



The main characteristics of Cyprus climate, is hot and dry summers from mid May to mid September, the rainy but mild winters from mid November to mid March and the two transitional seasons, Autumn and Spring. During Summer, weather in Cyprus is under the influence of seasonal barometric low, which has a centre in

Southwest Asia. Results of this effect are the high temperatures and clear skies. The rainfall is very low with an average value does not exceed 5% of the average total rainfall of the year as a whole. In winter Cyprus weather is affected by frequent small depressions and fronts moving towards the Mediterranean from west to east. Weather disturbances usually last from one to three days each time giving most of the annual rainfall. The total average rainfall in the months December, January and February correspond to about 60% of the annual rainfall in Cyprus. *In April*, The days are pleasantly warm, but temperature may fall a bit at night. Medium-weight and summer apparel: Light woolies and cardigans or long sleeved cotton for the evenings. Electricity and Electric Sockets in Cyprus

The electricity supply in Cyprus is 230 volts, a.c. 50 Hz. Sockets are usually 13 amp, square pin in most buildings. More than one low current rating appliance may be operated from the same supply point by using an adaptor (i.e. radios, electric clocks etc.). The use of adaptors for operating high current rating appliances is not recommended (i.e. electric heaters, toasters, irons etc.). Many hotels provide adaptors upon request from



the reception. Adaptors can also be purchased from electricians, supermarkets, grocery shops etc.

Water in Cyprus



Water is safe to drink in Cyprus. Water pollution is negligible and every home has fresh running drinking water. Tap water in hotels, restaurants, public premises, etc, is also safe to drink.

Measurements in Cyprus

Cyprus uses the metric system of weights and measures. Temperatures are reported in degrees Celsius, petrol is sold by the litre, grocery items are in grams and kilograms, fabric lengths in metres and road speeds are and distances posted in kilometres.

Driving in Cyprus

When it comes to driving in Cyprus, the number one question we get asked is...

What side of the road do you drive on in Cyprus? Like in the UK, in Cyprus you drive on the left hand side of the road.

What's more, because of the influence of the UK in Cyprus, many of the road signs are similar, as are the traffic lights system.



Speed limits are also similar to the UK, but you must bear in mind, in Cyprus (like mainland Europe) measurements are in kilometres.

Time Difference in Cyprus

Cyprus is two (2) hours ahead of the UK time (GMT+2).

Cyprus is the third largest island in the Mediterranean.

The Island of Aphrodite, goddess of love and beauty, who according to legend, was born here. Cyprus has a long turbulent history tracing back over nine thousand years, each period from Neolithic age, the ancient Greeks and the Romans leaving its trace.

Nicosia is the capital of Cyprus, with history dating back 5000 years. Sadly, Cyprus was invaded by Turkey in 1974 leaving 36% of the island illegally occupied. This includes half of the island's capital, now the last divided capital in the world.

Limassol is the largest sea side town in Cyprus. Here is situated the main port of the island and also the location of the annual wine festival of Cyprus. A lot of vineyards and wineries are spread around the town, on the nearby mountains. Limassol is also famous of its nightlife.

Larnaca is the home to the main International Airport of Cyprus. Probably, the most appealing site of Larnaca is Phoinikoudes (Palm trees) beach in the city centre. A great place to have a walk along the promenade, relax on the beach of have a bite at one of the many surrounding restaurants and cafes. Also from its Marina, boat trips can be taken, visiting the local Zenobia wreck, a sunset cruise or a day cruise around Larnaca bay.

Paphos is known as the birthplace of Aphrodite. With a history dating back thousands of years, it is a perfect destination with lots to see. The small fishing harbour is a very charming point with lots of taverns and coffee shops. Also there are many places of archaeologist interest as the Tombs of the Kings, where royals were buried.

Ayia Napa and Protaras have become popular holiday destinations in recent years. They are famous for their golden sandy beaches, attracting a vast number of tourists each year. There are a variety of hotels, bars, restaurants and leisure facilities to please all manner of visitors.

The Mountain of Troodos is situated on the south western part of Cyprus and it rises to 1.952m above the sea level. Nestled within this region are some of the islands most picturesque and tranquil local communities. Charming villages, many with cobbled streets and preserved traditional architecture build on terraced slopes, vineyards, almond trees, apple and cherry blossoms!

Palm Trees Promenade (Foinikoudes)

The Palm Trees Promenade (Foinikoudes) is one of the most cosmopolitan seafront areas in the whole of Cyprus as it includes a number of busy cafes and restaurants. Next to this beautiful avenue lies a popular sandy beach awarded with the EU Blue Flag.

Larnaca Marina & The Colonial Pier

A walk on the historic Larnaca Marina Pier is a traditional social activity of the people of Larnaca. Glass bottom boat trips also start from here in the Larnaca Bay up to the "Zenobia Wreck" which is ranked amongst the word's 10 best wreck diving sites.



Larnaca Medieval Castle

Standing proudly at the end of Athens Avenue you simply cannot miss the Larnaca Medieval Castle. It was founded during the Byzantine era as the first fortification in the 12th century. A museum featuring interesting collections is located in the Castle. The view from the top roof is stunning!

Pierides Museum

Get a glimpse through time by visiting the Pierides Museum. On Zenonos Kitieos street No.4 this museum exhibits a fascinating private collection of Cypriot antiquities covering 9000 years of Cypriot Art. Modern sculptures are exhibited in the garden of the Museum.



Europe Square & Municipal Art Gallery

It is at the beginning of Athens Avenue and is decorated with the first colonial buildings the British Administration built in Cyprus in 1879. The Colony's Governor building, the chief Port Master's office, the Chief Customs Officer residence and the colonial port warehouses are some of these old buildings now restored to accommodate the Municipal Art Gallery.

Zenon of Kition Statue

Great Philosopher born in Larnaca (Ancient Kition) in 334 B.C. and founder of the Stoic School of Philosophy. He was the first to divide philosophy into logic, physics and ethics. He taught that "the purpose of human existence is the virtuous life, which is the life in accordance with nature".



General Kimon's Bust

The Athenian General Kimon who aimed to free Cyprus from the Persian rule in the 5th century B.C. Known as the General who "even in death, he was victorious" because on his deathbed, he urged his officers to conceal his death from both their allies and the Persians.

Saint Lazarus Church & Ecclesiastical Museum

This stone build church is the most important surviving Byzantine monument in Cyprus. Built in 890 by Byzantine Emperor Leo VI on the resting place of St. Lazarus whose tomb lies under the sanctuary and can be visited. An ecclesiastical museum which exhibits important religious icons and artefacts is located in the back yard of the church.



<u>Traditional City Quarter (Laiki Yeitonia)</u>

The quarter of the town between Dionysos and Kosma Lysioti streets is characterised by its Cypriot traditional architecture of the early 20th century. Laiki Yeitonia is a busy entertainment area worth visiting at night for a few drinks and a nice traditional meal.

Kyriazis Medical Museum - "Paris Klerides Parents" House"...!

A unique in its kind museum in Cyprus which presents the medical, healing and health history of the island. Exhibits include forgotten medical sayings and poetry, an X-ray machine, surgical instruments and a pharmacists display unit filled with plenty of interesting things.



Note: There are numerous attractions and places of interest in the Larnaca city and district, however all the above can be covered in a 2-3 hour walking tour of the city.

Kamares - The Old Aqueduct of Larnaca

At the exit from Larnaca towards the Limassol highway you see the grandiose arches (Kamares) of the 16 kilometers long, 18th century aqueduct of Larnaca.

For the adventurer the old aqueduct of Larnaca offers a tremendous challenge. Walking in a straight line from the 1st arches (about 2-3 kilometers), you arrive at the 2nd arches, and after a walk of almost the same distance, (but having to pass the airport "bypass highway") you arrive at the 3rd and lower arches. At this point you have to look for the old mill, which pumped the aqueduct's water.

Then, for almost 9 kilometers up to the river, the water-channel goes underground, but every 30 meters you can see the "visiting wells" of this unbelievable project, which channeled the water of the river Tremithos to Larnaca till the 1950's.

Many researchers and historians believe that this tremendous public work has existed since Roman times, (as it's mentioned in the acts Secret of Apostle Barnabas) and that the Ottoman Governor Bekir Pashia reconstructed the whole project in 1745 on the basis of the surviving facilities. This argument is supported by the fact that a similar water channel exists in the archaeological site of the ancient port at Kilkis Street and at many other spots in the city dated in Hellenistic and Roman times.



Places of Worship

In Larnaca you can worship your God, no matter whether you are a Christian Anglican, Armenian, Evangelical, Catholic, Orthodox or Moslem. The Anglican worship at St. Helena's church at Ag. Elenis Street, the Armenians at Saint Stefan's church, Armenian Church Street, the Evangelists at Apostolidou - Lenas Street, the Catholics at Terra Santa church, Orthodox in the numerous Orthodox churches in town, which have regular services every Sunday 8-9:30 am. The Moslems can worship at the historical Beyuk Mosque, Ankara Street, opposite the Larnaca Castle, which is also open for the public on a regular basis.

<u>Traditional Villages Excursion – Lefkara and Kato Drys</u>

FREE DAY - SATURDAY 26 APRIL 2014

9:00 – Visit at St. Lazarus Church (nearby hotel) – 15 minutes tour with a guide.

9:30 – Excursion starts. To the way to Lefkara village, we are passing by the Salt Lake and Hala Sultan Tekke.



10:15 – Arrival at Lefkara village. We will be welcomed with a local drink and have a guided tour through the narrow street with its houses built in traditional architectural style, with the traditional "Lefkara Stone" which with the clay tiled roofs, give a distinctive look. Along the streets we will see women hand-make the famous lace called "lefkaritika". Also we'll experience the making of a traditional sweet, "loukoumia" and visit Lefkara Church which is dedicated to the Holy Cross and dates back to the 14th century.

Time for rest and coffee...

11:30 – Village of Karo Drys. On the way to Kato Drys, we will visit a local winery, experiencing wine tasting and then in the village we will visit the Honey Museum.

13:30 – Having launch at tavern "Platanos" (plane-tree). The tavern was named by the huge tree that was planted there, by a resident of the village, in 1907. It welcomes you and you can rest in its dew, you can have your coffee and eat the traditional foods of the restaurant.

15:00 - Return to hotel.

Championship Rules and Regulations







FIDE Zone 1.10 1st European Small Nations Individual Championship

1. Invitation

The Cyprus Chess Federation and FIDE Zone 1.10, with the support of ECU and the FIDE Events Commission, are pleased to invite the members of Zone 1.10 to the 1st European Small Nations Individual Championship.

2. Tournament System

- 2.1. The event will be a twelve-player round-robin event and all players will be hosted on a full board basis in Larnaca, Cyprus.
- 2.2. Each member Federation is invited to send one player as its representative.
- 2.3. The host Federation will have 2 players and the 12th player will be selected from the top 3 players of the Zone.
- 2.4. Players accept that they have read the FIDE and Tournament Regulations and are obliged to follow them.
- 2.5. The Tournament Director is Mr Paris Klerides (General Secretary of the Cyprus Chess Federation) and may be contacted at parisklerides@gmail.com or on +357 99663686. Skype account is parisklerides.

3. Time Control

For each player 90 minutes for the first 40 moves, followed by 30 minutes for the rest of the game with an increment of 30 seconds per move from move one.

4. Draw Offers

The players cannot draw a game by agreement before black's 30th move. A claim for a draw before black's 30th move is permitted only through the Chief Arbiter (or his Deputy) in the cases of perpetual check or threefold repetition."

5. <u>Travel Expenses and Airport Transfers</u>

Travel expenses shall be covered by the participating Federations or players. All players and accompanying persons are kindly asked to notify the organizers of their travel arrangements.

The transfer from the airport to the hotel in Larnaca will be managed by the organizers, free of charge. For any additional information about Larnaca we suggest the following site: www.larnakaregion.com.

6. Board & Lodging

The participants will be provided with full board and lodging from dinner of the 21st April 2014 to breakfast of 1st May 2014.

The Cyprus Chess Federation is also pleased to host one official from each member Federation, on a full board basis, between the 27th and 30th April 2014. A meeting for the Small Nations will be held during this time and the Cyprus Chess Federation will also try and set up a FIDE Trainer's, Arbiter's or Organizer's seminar for these officials depending on the financial assistance which may be provided by the relevant interested parties.

Any additional accompanying person will have to pay for their stay, directly in the hotel. The Zone Council will ensure that the playing hall and hotel is up to international standard.

7. Prizes and Trophies

The prizes for the event are:

 1^{st} – €2000 euros, 2^{nd} – €1500 euros, €3rd – 1000 euros.

In case of a tie, any prize money will be split equally.

If two or more players tie for any of the first three places, the tie to decide the awarding of the trophies will be broken (in descending order) by:

- Direct encounter
- The greater number of wins
- Sonneborn Berger
- Score Koya System

The winner of the Zone Championship will be one of FIDE president nominations for FIDE World Cup 2015.

8. Drawing of Lots and Pairings

The drawing of Lots will be made during the Technical meeting or Opening Ceremony at the start of the event. Players will be called out to select a number based on their rating with the highest rated player first.

Pairings will be made with Swiss Manager Software and pairings/results will be posted on the official website as well as on Chess-Results.com.

9. Appeals Committee

- The Appeals Committee will be selected prior to the first round during the Technical Meeting.
- This Committee shall consist of three members and two reserve members. Its
 members will be chosen by the players from their own number or from
 representatives of the national federations present at the tournament. The
 members of the Committee should belong to different federations.
- No member of the Committee is entitled to take decision in cases affecting a player of his own federation.
- The protest must be accompanied with the sum of €50 EUR, as a deposit from the signatory. If the protest is accepted and the decision changed, then the deposit will be returned back to the claimant. Otherwise money will be transferred to the Cyprus Chess Federation's Treasury.
- Protests must be submitted to the Appeals Committee in writing, not more than 30 minutes after the end of the relevant playing session.
- The Committee shall reach its decision before mid-day on the day following the protest. Its decision is final.
