### **Report of Independent Certified Auditors**

To the President and Members of the **Fédération Internationale des Echecs** 

We have audited the accompanying financial statements of Fédération Internationale des Echecs (The 'Federation') – a non profit federation, consisting of a balance sheet, statement of activities and Notes, for the year ended December 31, 2006.

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of these financial statements in accordance with the Accounting Standards applicable in Switzerland. This responsibility includes: designing, implementing and maintaining internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error; selecting and applying appropriate accounting policies; and making accounting estimates that are reasonable in the circumstances.

Our responsibility is to express an opinion on these financial statements based on our audit. We conducted our audit in accordance with International Standards on Auditing. Those standards require that we comply with ethical requirements and plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance whether the financial statements are free of material misstatement.

An audit involves performing procedures to obtain audit evidence about the amounts and information in the financial statements. The procedures selected depend on the auditor's judgment, including the assessment of the risks of material misstatement of the financial statements, whether due to fraud or error. In making those risk assessments, the auditor considers internal control relevant to the entity's preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the entity's internal control. An audit also includes evaluating the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of accounting estimates made by management, as well as evaluating the overall presentation of the financial statements.

We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our audit opinion.

In our opinion, the financial statements referred to above present fairly in all material respects, the financial position of the Federation as at December 31, 2006 and its activities for the year then ended, in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in Switzerland.

As with other entities of similar size and structure with the Federation, the Treasurer is actively involved in measuring, executing and recording transactions in the accounting records. For these reasons we have relied on Treasurer's representations as to the completeness of the financial information included in these financial statements.

#### 1. FEDERATION'S FORMATION AND OPERATIONS

The International Chess Federation or Federation Internationale des Echecs, (the 'Federation'), is the recognized international federation in the domain of chess, which was founded on July 20, 1924 in Paris. The Federation is recognized by the International Olympic Committee as the supreme body responsible for the game of chess and its Championships. The Federation unites national chess federations throughout the world and oversees all International competitions. The Federation is concerned exclusively with chess activities.

### 2. BASIS OF FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

The accompanying financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the requirements of the Federation's statutes.

The financial statements have been prepared on the historical cost basis.

#### 3. SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

(a) Foreign currency translation: The Federation changed its functional currency in 2006 to Euro (€). Transactions denominated in other currencies are recorded in € at the actual exchange rate as of the date of the transaction. At the end of the financial year monetary assets and liabilities denominated in foreign currencies are translated and reported at the rates of exchange prevailing at the year end. Gains or losses resulting from such foreign currency conversions are reflected in the statement of income. All foreign currencies are converted into Euro as follows:

- (b) **Provisions:** Debtors are stated at nominal value, net of provision for doubtful debts, which cover all members in arrears in fulfillment of their financial obligations to FIDE, temporarily excluded or to be excluded as per FIDE statutes (A.01, page 4, rule 2.5). In 2005 in particular, a provision against Royalties receivable from DGT, the company producing electronic clocks, was set up for the first time covering the unpaid balance at year end.
- (c) **Fixed assets depreciation:** Depreciation rate used is 30% per annum on the reduced balance method.
- (d) **Revenue recognition:** Membership, entry and other fees are recorded as income in the year they are earned.

### 6. Creditors

During the year, the organizers of upcoming Mexico World Cup paid the Federation an advance of US \$ 1.660.000 (Euro 1.258.280). This advance was invested by the Federation in a US \$ Time deposit, included within Bank accounts at December 31, 2006.

### 7. Staff retirement indemnities

Under Greek labor law, employees are entitled to termination payments in the event of dismissal or retirement, with the amount of payment varying in relation to the employee's compensation, length of service and manner (dismissed or retired) of termination, which if due to retirement is 40% of the amount payable upon dismissal. Employees who resign or are dismissed with cause are not entitled to termination payments. The number of employees who will eventually be dismissed or retired in subsequent years is not known; the maximum liability under the provisions of Greek labor law, had all employees retired at 31st December 2006, would have been  $\[mathbb{c}$  7,601 an amount that burdened 2006 results as it is accounted for the first time this year.
