System of the Candidates Matches, the rate of play, tiebreaks

Each match shall be played over six games and the winner of a match shall be the first player to score 3.5 points or more.

The time control for each game shall be: 2h/40 moves + 1h/20 moves + 15 minutes for the rest of the game plus an additional 30 seconds per move starting from move 61.

Tie-breaks

- (a) If the scores are level after the regular six games, after a new drawing of colours, four
 (4) tie-break games shall be played. The games shall be played using the electronic clock starting with 25 minutes on the clock for each player with an addition of 10 seconds after each move.
- (b) if the scores are level after the games in paragraph 3. 7. 1, then, after a new drawing of colours, two (2) five-minute games shall be played with the addition of 10 seconds after each move.
- (c) If the score is still level, the players shall play a single decisive sudden death game. The player, who wins the drawing of lots, may choose the colour. White shall receive 6 minutes, Black shall receive 5 minutes, without any addition. The winner qualifies for the next round. In case of a draw the player with the black pieces qualifies to the next stage of the World Chess Championship cycle.
