After the introduction of the main points of the idea, the details were further discussed. The participants agreed the following:

(A) Name of the event: *I. World Chess Games for Disabled*

(B) Date: *22. - 29. 10. 2011 in Dresden*

(C) Participation: *The competition is an event only for disabled chess players and each world association regulates the participants*

(D) Tournament: *7 round swiss tournament*

- *1+2+1+2+1*
- *(Mo arrival + Tue -> Sa play + Su departure)*
- *rounds: 9:00 - 14:00, 16:00 – 21:00 , closing ceremony 16:00*

(E) Time control:

For each player 90 minutes for the first 40 moves, followed by 30 minutes for the rest of the game with an increment of 30 seconds per move from move one.

(F) Titles and prizes:

The winner receives the title "Champion of World Chess Games for Disabled".

In the three "parts" the winner receives the title:

- *"Winner of World Chess Games for Disabled (Braille)"*
- *"Winner of World Chess Games for Disabled (Deaf)"*
- *"Winner of World Chess Games for Disabled (Physically Disabled)"*

The winner of the team competition (4 players + 1 reserve) receives the title:

"Best team of the I. World Chess Games for Disabled"

(G) Financial matters:

The entry fees will be 40€. The Organiser invites the president, one arbiter and the best player of the IBCA, ICSC and IPCA (for free in Dresden).

(H) Accommodation:

The organiser will offer suitable board and lodging for the players at the lowest possible price.

Mr Jarrett propose to ask each federation, what the disabled associations want to know (please send the questions to FIDE). In August 2011 a meeting for all open questions will be organised in Dresden.

At the end all participants hope that the “World Chess Games for Disabled” will be a success and ask the FIDE, the national federations and all interested chess player to help this new idea.
