19-29 AUGUST 2015, ULAANBAATAR, MONGOLIA

CHIEF ARBITER'S REPORT

The World Youth Under-16 Chess Olympiad were held in the Hotel Chinggis, in ULAANBAATAR, MONGOLIA, from 19 (day of arrival) to 29 August (day of departure) 2015.

Events and System of play:

The chess event in World Youth Under-16 Chess Olympiad was a Team Swiss tournament. Each team shall comprise 4 players and 1 reserve (one of whom must be a girl). Swiss system 10 rounds.

The FIDE approved Swiss Manager program for making the pairings was used. FIDE ratings for Standard play were used. The August FIDE rating list was used.

163 Players in 35 Teams from 20 Federations There were 1 GM and 7 IM.

It was agreed that the pairings were to be done using the match points using Swiss system. There was full agreement from all the team captains. Venue:

The playing venue was the Hunnu Mall. All players captains and officials were provided with special cards for entering the playing venue.

The playing hall was comfortable, with good conditions of light, air conditioning and ventilation.

All facilities were provided by the Organizer in the playing venue. There was water and tea for free. The toilets were close to the playing hall.

Time control:

90 minutes for 40 moves plus 30 minutes for the rest of the game with 30 seconds increment from the first move.

The game default time was set to 30 minutes. Because it will take at least 30 minutes from the hotel to the playing hall.

Top 5 teams get meddles and certificates. Top 3 individuals of all 5 boards get meddles and certificates. Also special meddles and certificates for the Top 3 scored girls of whole tournament.

Organization:

The Organiser did a good job. Where there were short comings, it was immediately resolved by officials of the Mongolian Chess Federation. The competition was held at a high level. The condition of play was also excellent and the tournament hall was very well prepared.

Conclusion:

World Youth Under-16 Chess Olympiad 2015, held in Ulan Bator, Mongolia, was a successful event. Although there were some minor matters like changes to some player' name and rating after first round. Overall the tournament ran smoothly without any appeal and all the players play fair without compromising. All requirements mentioned in the FIDE Handbook for organizing this kind of events were completely fulfilled.

This was the first time I presided as Chief Arbiter for such a high level competition.
