FIDE Trainers' Commission (TRG) FIDE PB 2/2015 (Abu Dhabi - UAE * 01-09.09.2015) REPORT - September 2nd, 2015

Dear Mr. President,

Here is our 2nd Commission's Report for the FIDE EB/PB 2/2015. We have held our Meeting of this period during the FIDE Congress in Abu Dhabi (02.09.2015). We have noted all proposals and decisions concerning the operation of our Commission and we have informed the Executive Director and we were able to solve in perfect harmony all subjects. Most of the **TRG Minutes** contents concerns formalities and general every-day work, but there are some issues which should be exclusively decided by the PB. From these extensive **Minutes** we ask you to approve the following:

- **1. New TRG Titles:** TRG Council voted on applications and confirmed seminar results according to the TRG Regulations and approved the attached titles (Annex: TRG-01-New Titles).
- **2. TRG Academies:** The Council examined Academies' applications as follows:
- **2.1.** By the 'Madrid Chess Academy' (Madrid Spain * Annexes: TRG-02-FIDE Academy Application Spain 1 & 2). The Council rejected the application, as under the present circumstances the Academy Application cannot be accepted.
- **2.2.** By the 'Stefanova Chess International Academy' (Sofia Bulgaria * Annex: TRG-02-FIDE Academy Application Bulgaria 2). The Council endorses the application.
- **2.3.** By the 'Orlov Chess International FIDE Academy' (Seattle & Redmond US America * Annex: TRG-02-FIDE Academy Application USA 5). The Council endorses the application, based on the following answers from USCF: Dear Efstratios, The US Chess Federation endorses the FIDE Academy request of the Orlov Chess Academy. Guadalupe US Chess Federation Director of Events Zonal President, FIDE Zone 2.1 (USA) (21.07.2015) Dear Efstratios, Attached is the FIDE Academy Application for Orlov Chess International FIDE Academy incorporating Seattle International FIDE Academy of Chess. - **2.4.** By the 'Washington International FIDE Academy of Chess' (Seattle US America * Annex: TRG-02-FIDE Academy Application USA 6 1 & 2). The Council endorses the application.
- **2.5.** By the 'Enhance Institute of Chess Excellence' (Durham England * Annex: TRG-02-FIDE Academy Application England 3). The Council endorses the application.
- **3.** Chairman Proposals: Chairman A. Mikhachishin wishes to remind earlier proposals (Annex: TRG-03-Chairman Proposals).
- **4. TRG Budget 2016:** The Council formed and approved the proposed Budget for 2016 (Annex: TRG-04-Budget 2016).
- **5. Medical Commission:** The Council accepted the proposal of Medical Commission's Chairwoman Ms. Jana Bellin in cooperation regarding seminars and surveys.
- **6. TRG-CIS Cooperation:** The Council expresses its dissatisfaction in its cooperation with CIS. The proposal is to remove the SI title which was requested by CIS and prepared by TRG, but was never implemented, on CIS's responsibility. Furthermore, after studying the CIS program, the Council expresses once again its dissatisfaction on it and disappointmed that there was no previous info on it, taking into

account a previous FIDE decision, that all educational programs and titles should be operated by TRG. The Council feels that it is up to FIDE to clear-up the matters.

7. TRG-FIDE Books: The Council expresses its dissatisfaction on the fact that most of the FIDE books doesn't reach the licenced trainers, on federations' responsibility. Cooperation with the FIDE Arena should be established in order to inform all the trainers. Councillor J.Petronic will be responsible.



- The International FIDE Academy at the University of Washington will promote the FIDE Chess in Schools (CIS) program by requiring every International FIDE Academy of Chess at the University of Washington U19

junior trainee to obtain FIDE Student Membership: i.e., <u>EITHER</u> FREE <u>FIDE</u> <u>Basic Student Membership</u> (email FIDE membership card and monthly FIDE newsletter) <u>OR</u> optional (10 euros) <u>FIDE Premium Student</u> <u>Membership</u> (plastic photo ID FIDE membership card and biweekly FIDE magazine -- junior trainees with a FIDE Premium Student Membership will also receive a personal Chess in Schools (CIS) Student Rating with a CIS rating floor of 600 -- CIS student ratings should not be confused with official FIDE ratings above 1000 which follow much stricter FIDE rating requirements).

- The International FIDE Academy of Chess at the University of Washington may offer chess instruction and playing opportunities for all ages including adult players and senior players. These opportunities will range from beginning, recreational and intermediate players, and in collaboration with the Orlov Chess International FIDE Academy and other distinguished chess trainers to all levels of training for FIDE world championships.
- The International FIDE Academy of Chess at the University of Washington
 will assist trainees in establishing FIDE ratings, including by holding Under
 1600 G/60 tournaments, and will thereby exponentially expand the
 international pool of FIDE rated players, including new players above the
 lowered FIDE rating floor 1000.
- In addition to submitting its internal tournaments for FIDE Rating
 Calculations, the International FIDE Academy of Chess at the University of
 Washington will support increased titled international GM, WGM, IM,

 all FIDE rated tournaments in the Pacific Northwest, including the

- Faculty of the International FIDE Academy of Chess at the University of Washington may apply to the University of Washington Graduate School to establish an interdisciplinary Graduate Certificate in Chess Studies (or in Chess Theory & Praticee) (15+ credits) which would be open to all Graduate Student trainees of the International FIDE Academy of Chess at the University of Washington. Faculty of the International FIDE Academy of Chess at the University of Washington may request the University of Washington Graduate School to establish a Graduate School Interdisciplinary Committee on Chess Studies (or on Chess Theory & Practice). Any such interdisciplinary faculty committee may apply to the UW Graduate School to be established as a degree-offering interdisciplinary group. UW Graduate School Memo 43: Graduate

- The International FIDE Academy of Chess at the University of Washington may explore the question where does chess belong in the academic curriculum? Should chess studies be offered as a UW Graduate Certificate? As undergraduate and graduate degree programs? Should chess have its own school on campus, like the University of Washington School of Music, the University of Washington School of Art, the University of Washington School of Drama, and the University of Washington School of Law? Should UW emulate the influential university chess programs in several countries including Russia and China? At this premier world research university, a University of Washington School of Chess could become the leading such institution worldwide.
- The International FIDE Academy of Chess at the University of Washington faculty may propose such undergraduate courses as Chess Fundamentals (5 credits), Learning Interdisciplinary Moves through Chess (5 credits), Critical Problem Solving and Chess (5 credits), Rowing, Chess and the Aristotelian Pursuit of Excellence (5 credits), and may propose such graduate courses as Advanced Chess Theory (5 credits), Artificial Intelligence and Chess (5 credits), Jurisprudence of Chess (4 credits), Nature or Nurture? Lazlo Polgar's ChesPsychology (5 credits), Chess Discipline or Interdiscipline? (5 credits), Birth of Modern Statistics: Chess & Arpad Elo (5 credits), etc. Graduate school chess courses would also be open to advanced undergraduates. The common element of all chess courses should be that each would be proposed solely due to faculty interest.
- Whenever circumstances allow, the International FIDE Academy of Chess at the University of Washington may host a Masters-in-Residence (Washington Masters-in-Residence program).
- A primary role of the International FIDE Academy of Chess at the
 University of Washington will be to serve as an interdisciplinary center for
 the scholarly study of chess and for the publication of scholarly research
 and ideas about chess. The International FIDE Academy of Chess at the
 University of Washington may hold interdisciplinary academic
 conferences on chess-related themes.
- The International FIDE Academy of Chess at the University of Washington may publish a scholarly journal under the name Scholar's Mate the International Interdisciplinary Intellectual Journal exploring Chess & the Life of the Mind (or Scholar's Mate the American Chess Journal).

- Upon the request of any certified and licenced FIDE trainer -- FIDE Senior Trainer (FST), FIDE Trainer (FT), FIDE Instructor (FI), National Instructor (NI), Developmental Instructor (DI) -- the International FIDE Academy of Chess at the University of Washington may offer such technical assistance as needed in registering new FIDE Academies worldwide.
- Another primary role of the International FIDE Academy of Chess at the University of Washington may be to serve as an incubator for ideas about chess.

In some circumstances, TRG accepts direct applications from the prospective FIDE Academy without requiring any accompanying endorsement by the National Chess Federation. FIDE Guideline 7.3.1.1.

The International FIDE Academy of Chess at the University of Washington addresses this official FIDE Academy application to our National Chess Federation USCF, with a simultaneous copy to TRG. Our situation is identical in all regards to that of other recently successful U.S. applications to become FIDE Academies by the USCF FIDE Academy in Crossville, TN; by the Marshall Chess Club in Manhattan, NY; by the Susan Polgar Institute for Chess Excellence (SPICE) at Webster University in St. Louis, MO; and by the Chess IQ Academy & Chess Center in Chicago, IL, whose various applications to become FIDE Academies were all recently approved by the Trainers' Council, FIDE Guideline 7.3.1.2, in addition to the existing charter American Chess University FIDE Academy in East Hanover, NJ.

On grounds therefore identical to the *USCF* FIDE Academy in Crossville, the *Marshall* FIDE Academy in New York City, the *SPICE* FIDE Academy at Webster University in St. Louis, and the *Chess IQ* FIDE Academy in Chicago, the applicant *International FIDE Academy of Chess at the University of Washington* now hereby requests that USCF endorse and that TRG approve the *International FIDE Academy of Chess at the University of Washington* as a FIDE Academy in Seattle, WA. REPETITION OF TRG PROPOSITIONS

We discussed with FIDE Events Commission Boris Kutin few problems of common interest during last half a year.

TRG proposed a few years ago propositions to change the role of reserve players during all FIDE competitions. Our ideas were not really considered by the FIDE Events Commission. So, we propose to discuss together with Events Commission during FIDE Congress in Abu Dhabi in September 2015.

Main problem for the teams with current system is different quantity of White and Black colours for different players.

Once more we remind our propositions. There are few options, as most of World team Captains demand the change of the role of reserve players.

- 1 Reserve player can play on every Board, according to team captain decision.
- 2 Team line up is random, as it is practiced in many countries during League competitions.

Of course, it will make more works for Arbiters, but it allows Captains to demonstrate real team strategy. And it will be much more interesting tournament fight, than old primitive system, based on unchanged Boards.

Board prizes are considered among players, which played more than half of the games on certain Board.

Possible variation is to establish winners simply on the teams' board order.

There are few other options, which can be discussed by the both Commissions .Additionally we can invite Arbiters Commission.
