# 0.1 Obituaries

# Section A: Administrative Matters

# 1. Report of the President

The Board noted that the Asian Chess Federation has accomplished or scheduled all the tournaments in the Asian calendar of 2015.

The popularity of tournaments for the youth was seen again in the large number of participants in the Asian Schools held in Singapore. The Asian Youth Championship was successfully organized in South Korea. All age groups under-8, 10, 12, 14, 16 and 18 were held together in the city of Suwon.

The Asian Continental Individual Championship was successfully organized in Al Ain with a record prize fund of \$87,000 for the Men's and Women's championship and for Rapid and Blitz championships. A record number of 32 federations participated in the Asian Championship which was held with 5-star accommodation.

Zonal championships were conducted in all Zones to select qualifiers for the World Cup. We thank the Zone Presidents for completing their events for both men and women.

It was emphasized that Asian calendar events are being organized by different federations across all Zones. The Asian Amateur Championship shall be organized by the Brunei Chess Federation. The Asian Seniors Championship shall be organized by the Iran Chess Federation. The Asian Juniors and Girls Championships shall be organized by the Kyrgystan Chess Federation.

New events are scheduled such as the Asian University Championship in Beijing, China.

Asian Chess Federation co-organized a number of Arbiters Seminars, August 2015 in Ulanbaatar, Mongolia, June 2015 in Riyadh, Saudi Arabia, June 2015 in Singapore, May/June 2015 in Dushanbe, Tajikistan, May 2015 in Muscat, Oman, Feb 2015 in Luang Prabhang, Laos and November 2014 in Delhi, India.

Asian Chess Federation will hold and has co-organized a number of Trainers Seminars, September 2015 in Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia, September 2015 in Larestan, Iran, August 2015 in Ulanbaatar, Mongolia, June /July 2015 in Male, Maldives, June 2015 in Singapore, Jan 2015 in Auckland, New Zealand, Nov 2014 in Delhi, India.

Asian Chess Federation co-organized an International Organizer Seminar Feb. 2015 in Makkah, Saudi Arabia. ACF conducted the first Rating Tournament in January 2015 in Laos and will conduct inaugural rating tournaments this year in East Timor, Cambodia and Nauru.

# 2. Financial Report

Treasurer Mehrdad Pahlevanzadeh submitted the financial report.

In view of the tragic earthquakes which have struck Nepal, it was agreed to write off the debts of Nepal Chess Federation for the year.

As required by UAE law, the board agreed that the ACF president is authorized to open a bank account and purchase assets for Secretariat operations of the Asian Chess Federation.

## 3. Affiliations

The Board welcomed the Nauru Chess Federation as our newest member.

#### 4. Replacement of Vice President

The Board noted that in accordance with ACF Statutes, Sheikh Sultan appointed Sheikh Musad Al Zuwahri of Saudi Arabia, former president of Al Ahli Club, as ACF Vice President replacing Alawi Al Zawawi of Oman.

# 5. Replacement of Executive Board Member

Asian Continental Assembly in Tromso was informed that the Mongolian Chess Federation replaces nomination of Genden Altan Och for disciplinary reasons. The Board noted that the Asian Chess Federation accepted the Mongolian Chess Federation nomination of Sainbayar Tserendorj to the Executive Board.

# 6. Appointment of Commission Chairmen

The Board noted that the President shall appoint other committee chairmen pending receipt of nominations and qualifications for the following commissions: Chess in Schools, Media/social network, Seniors, Disabled, Talented players, Excellence Awards and Marketing.

Asian Zonal 3.6 by the Australian Chess Federation 3-10 July 2015 in Sydney.

Asian Zonal 3.7 by the All India Chess Federation 4-18 Dec 2014 in Kottayam, Kerala

The Board applauded Zone President Rajesh Joshi for their first official event in Nepal.

#### 8. Asian Continental Men's and Women's Championships 2015

The event was held 1-13 August 2015 in Al Ain, UAE with record prize fund of \$87,000, a record number of 32 federations participating and in 5-star hotel accommodation and venue.

# 9. Asian Youth Championship 2015 Under-8, 10, 12, 14, 16 and 18

The Board applauded the Korean Chess Federation president and delegation present for successfully organizing the event 3-11 August 2015 in Suwon despite the negative publicity of the MERS epidemic. It was noted that in coordination with the organizers, the Under-6 category was discontinued.

### 10. Asian Schools Championship - 2015

The event was organized by the Singapore Chess Federation 30 May to 8 June 2015. The Board welcomed the new Singapore Chess Federation delegate Tony Tan.

#### 11. Asian Cities Team Championship 2015

The event was organized by the Sri Lanka Chess Federation 21-29 July 2015 in Colombo.

# 12. Asian Juniors and Girls Championships 2015

The Asian Juniors and Girls championships shall be organized by the Kyrgyzstan Chess Federation 2-12 October 2015 in Bishkek, Kyrgyzstan.

#### 13. Asian Amateur Championships - 2015

The event will be organized by the Brunei Chess Federation 6-13 September 2015.

#### 14. Asian Seniors 2015

The event will be organized by the Iran Chess Federation 24 September to 2 October in Larestan.

#### 15. Eastern Asian Youth Championship 2016

As approved by the 2013 Asian Continental meeting at the FIDE Congress in Talinn, Estonia, that the Eastern Asian Youth Championship shall be established. ACF president Sheikh Sultan declared that it is an opportunity for more players to participate.

The City of Tagaytay in cooperation with the National Chess Federation of the Philippines bids for the inaugural event.

Executive Board member Sainbayar Tserendorj proposed and the meeting approved that the three Asian regional events to be submitted to the Qualification Commission for Direct Titles are the Western Asian, Central Asian and Eastern Asian Youth championships for under-8, 10, 12, 14, 16, 18 and 20.

#### 16. Asian Continental Open and Women's Championships 2016

Uzbekistan Chess Federation bids for the event 25 May to 4 June 2016 in Hotel Uzbekistan, Tashkent.

The Board agreed to refer 2016 bids to the Asian Events and Competitions Commission.
