Chess Clock Bidding Procedure

Invitation for Bids (IFB)

FIDE is opening a bidding procedure for the rights:

- to have certain models of chess clocks designated as a "FIDE Championship Clock",
- to have certain models of chess clocks designated as an "Official FIDE Chess Clock",
- to have certain models of chess clocks designated as a "Chess Clock Recommended by FIDE for National Federations".

General Provisions

- FIDE will grant the winner(s) a non-exclusive right to use the FIDE logo in conjunction with the words "FIDE Championship Clock", "Official FIDE Chess Clock" and/or "Chess Clock Recommended by FIDE for National Federations" for one or more models included in the bid.
- This right would be granted for three (3) years starting August 01, 2019, and ending July 31, 2022.
- All chess equipment manufacturers, including those who were designated as "Producer of the Official FIDE Chess Clock" in the past, are eligible to participate in the bidding.
- FIDE retains the right to freely certify other chess clocks for competition use after testing. However, no other chess clocks could be designated as the "FIDE Championship Clock" or the "Official FIDE Chess Clock" prior to the expiry of the three-year period, i.e., July 31, 2022.
- FIDE will use the model(s) designated as the "FIDE Championship Clock" in its top-level competitions (Chess Olympiad, World Championship Match, Candidates Tournament, World Cup, Grand Prix) during this three-year period.
- FIDE will use the model(s) designated as the "Official FIDE Chess Clock" in its other official competitions included in the FIDE Calendar (e.g., World Seniors Ch., World Team Ch., World Youth Ch.) during this three-year period.
- FIDE will make available its development fund, subject to certain criteria established solely by FIDE, to subsidize, in whole or in part, the purchases by its member federations of the clock models designated as the "Chess Clock Recommended by FIDE for National Federations".
- The Agreement between FIDE and a winner can be terminated by a written notice given by either party at least six months in advance.

The Bidding Documents

Each bid shall contain the following mandatory information:

- The bidder's legal name, signatures and authentication
- The bidder's professional affiliations and permits, if any.
- The payments to FIDE, in Euros, that the bidder undertakes to make over the three-year period for each of his clocks that is designated as the "FIDE Championship Clock", the "Official FIDE Chess Clock" or the "Chess Clock Recommended by FIDE for National Federations".
- The bidder's commitment to make these royalty payments to FIDE on a quarterly basis.
- The royalties to FIDE, in Euros, that the bidder undertakes to pay to FIDE for each wholesale or retail sale of any clock that is designated as the "FIDE Championship Clock", the "Official FIDE Chess Clock" or the "Chess Clock Recommended by FIDE for National Federations".

- The bidder's commitment to provide to FIDE for testing (including free of charge shipping) all models of chess clocks included in the bid, ten (10) units per model, within seven (7) days after submission of the bid.
- The bidder's commitment to reimburse all expenses of the members of the FIDE Procurement Department (including expenses for transportation, accommodation, and meals) incurred for an on-site visit ("inspection") to an agreed-upon location in order to examine the bidder's chess clocks, to clarify the bid, and/or to address any related manners. Such visit shall occur at a mutually acceptable date anytime after the bid due date, including after the Agreement between FIDE and the winner is signed.

For each model of the chess clock included in the bidding, the bidder shall submit:

- A fully completed technical data sheet (TDS, see Annex).
- Product manuals.
- Audited results of field tests, if any.

All bidding documents and Annexes shall be submitted in English.

Bid Fee and Submission of Bids

The due date for bid submissions is July 15, 2019.

Every bid shall be accompanied by a non-refundable Bid Fee of 1,000 (one thousand) Euros payable to FIDE.

All bids should be submitted by the due date in a sealed envelope or electronically, as scanned documents, to the FIDE Secretariat, postal address: 54 Avenue de Rhodanie, Maison du Sport International, 1007 Lausanne, Switzerland / e-mail: office@fide.com by July 15, 2019, 14:00 UTC.

No late bids will be entertained.

Bid Evaluation and Award of Contract

Besides financial terms offered, FIDE will take into account the following criteria:

- The reputation of the Bidder and of the Bidder's products.
- The quality of the Bidder's products.
- The extent to which the products meet FIDE needs.
- The Bidder's past relationship with FIDE.
- The long-term cost to FIDE in acquiring the Bidder's goods.
- Warranties and other representations.

FIDE retains the right to accept any bid and to reject any or all bids.
